## **Suburban Hospital Expansion**

In mid-September 2012, the HTCA's attorney, Norman Knopf, appeared before the Court of Special Appeals (COSA) in Annapolis, MD. About a dozen HT residents and board members also attended. This was our community's second appeal of the October 2010 opinion of the Montgomery County Board of Appeals' (BOA) approval of Suburban Hospital's proposed expansion plan. The COSA is composed of a rotating three-judge bench. Decisions by them are often rendered slowly, sometimes taking six months or longer.

As of this writing, no decision has yet been announced. Our appeal was based on three matters of law challenging the actions and legal standard used by the BOA in reaching their 2010 Opinion and the subsequent negative impact on Huntington Terrace. When COSA renders its decision, if the finding either fully or partially supports HTCA's appeal, the case might possibly be remanded back to the BOA.

As always, when at a new legal crossroads, the HTCA board will present the current status in a community forum for discussion, input, and a formal vote on our community's next step. Please stay tuned.

# Paying Our (Membership) Dues
